AGE AND GENDER Male Aged 7 months

ETHNIC BACKGROUND Caucasian

PRESENTING SYMPTOMS AND HISTORY Patient was poked in the LE with a stick by big brother. Happened yesterday afternoon. Infant was distressed when it happened but settled quickly. Slept normally and does not seem bothered by it today, but this morning mum has noticed a red patch on the LE and a small cut below it, and is worried about it.

GENERAL HEALTH AND MEDICATION Good, no medication. Normal birth history, full term, CS.

POH/FOH none/father lazy eye since childhood (wore glasses and patch as child. No Rx currently)

VISION Cardiff Cards RE: 6/9 LE: 6/9

REFRACTION dynamic retinoscopy R +1.50DS L +1.75/-0.50 x 180

VA Distance Cardiff Test RE: 6/9 LE: 6/9

Near not measured

ACCOMMODATION not attempted

BINOCULAR STATUS Near cover test - no movement seen

MOTILITY Both eyes follow in all directions of gaze.

CONVERGENCE both eyes follow to nose

PUPIL REACTIONS Direct and consensual reflexes seen

FUNDUS EXAMINATION Media clear; maculae healthy
