

Downloading e-books: EBL

It is possible to download entire e-books on the EBL platform, to be read offline for a limited period.

Please note that if you are looking at a Science Direct or Ovid e-book, it will only be possible to download individual chapters.

Reading a book online is the first option. This may suit you if you have no problem with internet access.

Once a book is open, you can download it from the blue menu tabs on the left.

You will first need to install software or an app. These are free, and links are provided when you choose to download a book.

The options are:

- PCs: Adobe Digital Editions (ADE)
- iPads, iPhones or other smartphones: Bluefire reader app

When you are ready to download the book, choose the:

- format: ePub is the better option, but sometimes only PDF is offered
- number of download days- usually 1, 2, or 3. As the book will be unavailable to other readers during this time, some titles are limited to one day

The book will be stored in the reader for the period that you have downloaded it for.

There are also lots of useful FAQs on the EBL help/feedback link at the top of their screen.
